



## Museum of Jewish Heritage New York, NY

The relationship between the Museum and the design team is over fifteen years old and has resulted in a number of projects including several studies of potential sites for the Museum's collection and two design solutions. The firm provided MEP and life safety engineering design for the original facility in 1994 (not constructed) as well as for the new facility, designed by Kevin Roche John Dinkeloo and located in Manhattan's Battery Park opposite the Statue of Liberty shoreline.

The museum is an austere and dignified memorial commemorating the victims of the Holocaust; its six sides symbolizing the six million who died. Home to more than 800 historical and cultural artifacts and more than 2,000 photographs, the facility totals 30,000 sq ft, with 18,200 sq ft of gallery space. The museum's mechanical system was designed for maximum flexibility to accommodate modifications for temporary exhibits as well as future expansion.
